


#### **Elements Puzzle**



### B R I C S Platform for competition policy development

The changing nature of the competition laws & policy in the BRICS countries





#### Mixed methods approach:

- desk-based research
- quantitative and qualitative analysis (also through national contributors)

#### Theoretical and empirical analysis:

- Regulation/Legal framework
- Economic and societal/Political and business environment

#### **Policy responses**

#### Public national regulation:

- i) industry/sector-specific regulation;
- ii) economy-wide provisions.

#### Private regulation:

facilitated or limited by public regulation, creates for ex. food standards and product safety procedures.

#### Transnational regulation:

both public and private.

#### **Policy responses**

#### Policy responses addressing market dominance\*:

- Prevention of market dominance: merger law; cartel law
- Restraint conduct of dominant firm: misuse of market power; price control; industry codes
- Enforcement of laws of general application: unconscionable conduct; other legal measures (ex. unfair contracts)
- Destruction of market dominance: divestiture

- ii) uncover alternative policy responses addressing the whole FGVC and their 'interoperability'
